<u>Membership Expectations:</u> Please bear in mind the other commitments you have when planning your co-curricular music involvement. Make sure you do not over-commit yourself. If you are in a co-curricular group you are expected to understand and accept the following principles.

- 1. A performance takes precedence over any other rehearsal or sports practice
- 2. A clash of performances or sports games etc. <u>needs to be negotiated with your conductor or music teacher in charge.</u> Do not let down your group by simply not turning up without explanation.
- 3. <u>Arrive in plenty of time</u> to set up and warm up ready to start at the designated start time. <u>Do not arrive at rehearsal time.</u>
- 4. Prepare and practise your music between rehearsals.
- 5. If you are unable to attend a rehearsal due to illness or another valid reason you must notify your teacher in charge in advance. **Email is best.**
- 6. **The equipment Levy of \$50** All students will be billed after auditions and sign-up. The Equipment Levy is a one-time annual payment for one or more classes taken at the school.
- 7. A violin hire charge is \$75 per year.
